Pay Your Utility Bill by Text

Get a text message each time a new balance is posted to your account. Reply "Pay" to that message, and your account will be paid with the credit card on file. To set up text to pay, call 877-847-8583 and choose option 4 for Text-to-Pay. You will need your account number, cell phone number and the debit or credit card you want to use. Or you can enroll through the online payment portal. Find the link at [Waukee.org/UtilityPayment](https://www.waukee.org/UtilityPayment). In the portal, click the button that says, "Enroll in text to pay". After enrolling by phone or the online portal, you will immediately receive a text message to confirm enrollment. Follow the instructions to respond to the next to complete set-up for text to pay.
